### A HISTORY LESSON ON THE 'LOOPS'



In 1959, Fruit Loops were created to replace a failed Kellogg's cereal called OKs. (The individual pieces were shaped like the letters O and K.) OKs were Kellogg's attempt to create a bootleg version of the highly successful Cheerios cereal made by their competitor, General Mills. While the brand ultimately failed, Kellogg's had invested in a lot of special equipment to make OKs and didn't want the equipment to go to waste, so they created a new brand that could be made using the same machinery — Fruit Loops.

However, some people were upset at the name, as they felt that Kellogg's was falsely claiming that its cereal's flavor came from natural fruit ingredients. A lawsuit in 1963, Paxton v. Kellogg's, ultimately resulted in the company changing the name of its cereal to one that is instantly recognizable among modern consumers: <u>Froot</u> Loops.

Originally, it included just red, orange, and yellow "loops." (Over time, more colors were added, including blue and green.) Theoretically, the colors represented flavors like cherry, orange, and lemon. However, in the 1990s, Kellogg's finally admitted that all the different colors are really just for show, and that Froot Loops actually only come in a single flavor. Today, Froot Loops are known for having a lot of sugar and questionable ingredients, but still have plenty of fans, so they remain available on most grocery store shelves.
