News and Updates

There were 78 shoeboxes given for Operation Christmas Child this year. Thirty boxes were done online. When shoeboxes are built online, Samaritan's Purse can verify exactly what is in the box so they can go into places with many rules and regulations. They go to children in some of the hardest to reach areas. Thank you KBC for sending an opportunity for 78 children to hear the Gospel!

December Missions

This year we have two ministries to recommend for the WMU December Selection Missions: Rev. Victor Vula and Mercy Chefs.

I hope that you keep up with Victor's newsletter that is included in the KBC Newsletter. The fighting in Myanmar continues to escalate. Victor sends funds to support the work of their mother church to help provide shelter and food. As always, he has a list of needs and prayer requests for them. He continues to teach the children and spread the Gospel despite governmental restrictions. Please keep the people of Myanmar in your prayers and pray for Victor's safety as he works for his people.

The other ministry is Mercy Chefs. Mercy Chefs is a non-profit organization headquartered in Portsmouth, VA. They provide professionally prepared, restaurant quality meals to victims, volunteers, and first responders during natural disasters and emergencies. Their focus is on food, and lots of it. They are funded by large private donors and have a 96% Charity Navigator rating.

Mercy Chefs delivered food boxes to military families impacted by the government shutdown. Thousands of boxes and bags of produce were



handed out to military personnel on bases in the United States. Each box cost \$50 and contained all the ingredients to fix 50 meals.

When the hurricane hit Jamaica, an all-volunteer crew was sent to prepare hot meals for those who lost so much. They also responded to the earthquake in Myanmar and prepared thousands of meals there.

Food Pantry News



November was an amazing month for the Food Pantry. Just as scripture says in Matthew 25:35-40, "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat...", amazing individuals did amazing things to help the less fortunate in our community:

- St. Andrews Presbyterian and Kilmarnock Methodist Churches had food drives and provided a lot of foods needed to stock our pantry
- The WMU and the KBC congregation provided many Thanksgiving items for our pantry
- Kilmarnock Seventh Day Adventist Church provided a bag of cleaning supplies for each household.
- A lady who lives in Richmond but is building a house in Weems was led to help stock a pantry. She made a Costco run and delivered a large SUV full of goods – paper products, cleaning products, canned and packaged foods, hygiene items, etc.
- St. Andrews Presbyterian Church cooked and packaged turkey dinners and offered our food pantry recipients packaged dinners with a drive-through the

day before Thanksgiving. Six of our food pantry volunteers also picked up dinners and delivered them to our food pantry homebound neighbors.

A special thanks to all who provided monetary donations to be used to purchase turkey roasts for smaller households, full-sized turkeys for larger families, and all the other items for a thanksgiving meal that we could not procure through the Food Bank.

The Food Pantry on November 19 was exceptionally busy. As expected with folks wanting Thanksgiving items along with their regular distribution, we served 40% more households than our normal monthly average! This happens each year for the November and December food pantries. We served 63 households (34 children, 59 adults, and 55 seniors, for a total of 148 individuals)!

We also expect a larger number of clients for our December Food Pantry. We plan to have hams, canned yams, canned vegetables, stuffing, mashed potatoes, etc. If you would like to donate to our December food pantry needs with food items or monetary needs, it will be very much appreciated.

The KBC Food Pantry would like to thank all of you for your continued support! We wish a Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays to all!



Prayer Updates for Myanmar – November 2025

Our Activities for November

Parent Special Day: Preschool and K-5 parents enjoy spending time with their children at school, and the students love having their parents join them.

Book Characters Day: Each year, we host dress-up days, including our most recent Book Character Day, which is always a fun and enjoyable event.



Chapel with Richard: Each month, we hold chapel and assembly sessions where we share important Christian teachings and character-building topics with our students. In November, we especially enjoyed having Richard Utber from Australia speak to our students about salvation.

Humanitarian Aid – As fighting continues in northern Myanmar, including Chin State, my home state; many innocent people have lost their lives, and countless others have been forced to flee for safety. Our ministry continues to faithfully support through our partners. And we are grateful to share that our missionary partners remain steadfast in preaching and spreading the Gospel within their communities.







Prayer Updates

- For Godly and dedicated teachers We are fortunate to have many exceptional teachers who have served at VIS for many years. However, due to the ongoing situation in our country, some have had to leave, making it a significant challenge to recruit qualified replacements. Please pray that we may find both local and international teachers, especially for Math and Science in the upper grades.
- New Building and Land for sports facility Please continue to pray with us for the provision of a new building or the renovation of our existing one on the rented land. Last summer, we were unable to begin this project due to limited funds and the significant increase in construction material costs. For our younger students, who have spent the past fourteen years in these temporary classrooms, this renovation or new building is greatly needed.

We also ask for your prayers as we look for ways to develop a sports facility.

- Curriculum for High School We have been using the Bob Jones University (BJU) homeschool curriculum, which has served us well. However, as Myanmar citizens are currently banned to travel to the U.S., our students face challenges when pursuing high school continuation or college admission in Asia and Europe, since this curriculum is not accredited. Please pray that we can find a US-based, accredited curriculum that is suitable for our school.
- For peace and justice to be restored Please continue to keep us in your prayers. As our current government plans a sham general election in December (first phase) and January (second phase), new clashes have erupted in areas where they have lost control in preparation for the third phase. We also ask for your prayers for the safety of our teachers and students, and that peace may soon be restored in Myanmar.

Victory Community Chapel (VCC) – VCC remains committed to meeting each Sunday morning to teach the truth of God's Word, with young people leading in worship through songs and music. We are encouraged to see growing involvement, particularly from youth. Our tithes and offerings are used to support our missionary partners and to provide our weekly fellowship meals.
